Participants in the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) nutrition program and CalFresh (Food Stamps) are welcome to shop at the Value Market, as well as everyone participating in Medi-Cal and all REFB food distribution programs. Customers not enrolled in these programs can also self-verify based on household income. Friendly, bilingual cashiers are always available to help and to answer questions.

Value Market shoppers also receive the added benefit of the Value Market's location at the REFB, where they can receive information about REFB programs and referrals to our partner organizations. # REFB Free Summer Lunch for Children

From June 2 through August 8, the Redwood Empire Food Bank (REFB) will be offering 38,000 low-income children a healthy lunch and fun summer activities at 48 "Hunger-Free Summer" sites throughout Sonoma County.

Now in its 11<sup>th</sup> year, the REFB's ConAgra Foundation Hunger-Free Summer Program provides a nutritious meal to thousands of children who depend on free or reduced-price lunches during the school year, and miss these meals during summer vacation.

When the program was launched in 2004, 20,000 children were eligible. This year the number has risen to 38,000 children. In spite of a better economy, more families at the lower end of the wage scale still struggle to feed their children and families, turning to the REFB for help.

"There is an increased risk of hunger during summer months when school is out of session. Summer Lunch is the REFB's direct response to ensure that local children have access to healthy meals. Obtaining a meal is easy. No paperwork or sign up is required, and the program serves any child 18 years of age and under," explains Rita Guilford, Programs Manager.

Over a hundred volunteers are needed to help at the 42 lunch sites to serve meals and oversee fun educational activities. Garden-based nutrition activities introduce children to vegetable gardening and the benefits of eating healthy and fresh food. Recreational activities will be offered at some sites.

The **Redwood Empire Food Bank** (REFB) is the largest hunger-relief organization serving north coastal California from Sonoma County to the Oregon border. Since 1987, the REFB has fed hungry people, currently serving 78,000 children, families and seniors each month in Sonoma County, while striving to end hunger in our community. The REFB collaborates with local and regional partners to obtain and distribute over 13 million pounds of food annually, the equivalent of 29,900 meals every day.
